If your child has a runny nose, a sore throat or a mild cold and don't have underlying medical conditions, then they can still come to school as normal.

## Flu Immunisation – 17<sup>th</sup> November

Every year, flu kills thousands of people. The school age flu vaccination programme **helps protect children against flu**, which can be a very unpleasant illness and may lead to complications such as bronchitis and pneumonia. The flu vaccine also helps to prevent transmission of flu to the wider community, including older family members and new born babies who may have weaker immune systems.

As in previous years, the childhood immunisation team will be visiting schools in North Yorkshire to deliver this programme. The date they are visiting at Dishforth Airfield Primary School is Tuesday 17<sup>th</sup> November. The influenza vaccination programme will be offered to **all children of primary** 



school age, Reception to Year 6, as was the case in 2019. Children in nursery are **NOT** eligible to receive the vaccine.

The immunisation team will only administer the vaccine to child who are on their list, so it is vital if you wish your child to be vaccinated, that you complete the online consent form.

#### **ONLINE CONSENT FORM**

The childhood immunisation team have been working with schools and parents to improve the online consent form and they are pleased to announce it is a lot smarter and quicker to complete. Details of how to register your child for a flu vaccine were sent out on Friday. Here is a reminder of the link:

- 1. Go to https://www.hdft.nhs.uk/fluconsent/
- 2. Enter the School Code 121332 and click "Find School".
- 3. Complete the form with your child's information and parent/guardian contact information\*.
- 4. Click the green "Submit" button.

\*If you provide a **valid email address** you will receive an automatic email confirmation to say your form has been submitted. We will also email you to let you know that your child has been vaccinated in school. If your child has specific medical requirements one of our nurses may need to get in touch before we are due to visit school. We never pass on your contact information to third parties.


If you experience any problems in completing the consent form, please do not hesitate to contact the school office and we will be happy to provide assistance.

## <u>Reading</u>

All children need to read at home every day. Please listen to your child read and ask them questions about the text and / or pictures. Please ensure that you record what your child has read and how they have managed with their reading in their record book. Reading and record books need to be in school every day so that they can be checked and new books issued.

## <u>PE</u>

Please ensure that your child has their PE kit in school every day. The kit is a plain white t-shirt, navy / black shorts and trainers. As the weather turns colder, a plain navy or black tracksuit can be worn and I would also recommend a lightweight waterproof jacket. PE can take place in most weathers outside if children have the correct clothing!

#### **School Dinners**

The price for dinner is  $\pounds 2.75$  per meal ( $\pounds 13.75$  per week). The cost for the month of September is  $\pounds 46.75$ . Please ensure your Parent Pay account is up to date. It is possible to put credit onto the account to help with budgeting for the month!

#### **Packed Lunches**

A polite reminder that there should be no sweets or chocolate bars in packed lunches or fizzy drinks. Also, we are a **NUT FREE SCHOOL**. We do have children with allergies to nuts so please refrain from any sort of nut products in packed lunches – thank you.

#### **Playtime Snack**

Children in Reception, Year 1 and 2 receive a free fruit snack every day which is Government funded. Children in Year 3-6 can bring a piece of fruit in from home to keep in the classroom for playtime. I strongly recommend that you send fruit in for children in Year 3-6 as they have a long morning and often need a snack. Please can this be put in their book bag and not their packed lunch box as it is easier for them to access at break time – thank you.

#### Cycling To and From School – Be Safe Be Seen!

If your children are cycling to and from school please ensure that they wear a helmet and understand at least basic road safety. The road is narrow and busy so all users need to be aware of each other. May we politely remind you to take care when parking and collecting your bike from the shelter. *Please do not ride bikes or scooters in the school drive or playground at any time for safety reasons – thank you.*


