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# Newsletter 36 Monday 27th June 2022

Dear Parents / Carers,

I hope you all enjoyed the extended weekend due to the staff training day. We have a very enjoyable and busy few weeks left of the academic year – please keep checking diary dates at the end of the newsletter for any last-minute changes to events and timings.

On Thursday afternoon at 2pm we have the Reception starters parent session. This is for all parents who have a child in nursery who is starting in Reception in September.

At the end of this week we are saying goodbye and good luck to Miss Wright in the school office who is leaving us to pursue a new career stepping away from admin and into a charity-based organisation around hidden carers. On behalf of all the staff I would like to thank Miss Wright for all her hard work over the last two years and good luck for the future – we will all miss her!

Admin in the office will be limited for the next three weeks. #### **Class News:**

Every week the classes will share the highlights of what they have been learning about with our families:

**EYFS** – This week we have been looking at the non-fiction book 'Who is Hiding at the Seaside?' We have been finding out facts about different sea creatures and using these facts to help us identify animals. There has been lots of new vocabulary to discover in this book and we have spent time using these words in our own sentence.





















**Year 1 and 2 –** This week the children in Year 1/2 have been learning to solve mathematical problems using all four operations - some were very tricky! We have also been listening to different Bible stories including the story about Feeding the 5000 with 2 fish and 5 loaves of bread - this led to an interesting discussion about the homeless and people who do not have enough money for food. In Art we have continued to develop our water colour painting skills and have developed our brush techniques using broad strokes and then adding finer details.

**Year 3 and 4 –** We have been continuing to read our class novel "The Secret of Platform 13" and have been using our senses to write a description. In maths we are learning about angles and have been developing our skills using protractors. We have also been learning about the 320,000 different plants that exist on our planet and the different ways scientists categorise plants.

**Year 5 and 6 –** This week we have been looking into the reasons why the Vikings invaded Britain. We are investigating why they came to our country, how they travelled and what they did whilst they were here. We are also going to find out about the Battle of Lindisfarne.

We have appointed a new EYFS teacher for September who will be working Monday – Wednesday and we are delighted to welcome Mrs Sarah Wiseman to the team. If you have spare school uniform that you no longer need, please send it washed to the school office and a uniform sale will take place towards the end of the school year.


### Makaton sign of the week
