It is hard to believe that we only have two more weeks left of the academic year with a lot to fit in!

### **Class News:**

Every week the classes will share the highlights of what they have been learning about with our families:

**EYFS** – This week we have had ice in our classroom we have been loving watching what happens to it throughout the day and exploring how it changes. We have also set up an experiment to see which ice cube would melt the fastest. We now know why we need to be quick when eating ice lollies this summer! We have also been practising our knowledge of number facts and looking at the composition of different numbers.

**Year 1 and 2 –** This week Year 1 and 2 have been continuing to learn about Oliver's adventures with the rambling isles. He has just reached a cliff hanger and the children are excited to find out if Cliff gets his Water Mole back or if the sea monkeys will make more mischief! We have been practicing our problem-solving skills in Maths - working on the fraction of a shape or number. We have finished our water colour paintings and have added some extra details using the ink pens! We think they look amazing.

**Year 3 and 4 –** We have been continuing to read our class novel "The Secret of Platform 13" and have been looking at key events to help us write a persuasive letter. In maths we are learning about shapes and turns, and coordinates. We have also been out exploring the micro habitats where invertebrates like to live and recording our findings in tables.























**Year 5 and 6 –** This week we have begun writing a newspaper report on the Battle of Lindisfarne. We are using our knowledge of the Vikings to write eyewitness accounts for our report to understand the historic event from the perspective of the monks and the Vikings.






#### Year 5 day at Boroughbridge High School – today!

### New website for 4-7 yr olds - online safety



A new website has been launched <u>for 4-7 year olds</u> and an <u>accompanying guide for parents and carers</u>.

#### What's New?

The website is based on the three-episode <u>Jessie & Friends</u> animated series, which aims to equip 4-7 year olds with the knowledge, skills and confidence they need to stay safer online. It is intended to be used by 4-7 year olds alongside their parents and carers, or within education settings as a learning tool.

The new interactive website encourages 4-7s to engage safely online by helping them to recognise worrying, upsetting or scary situations and reinforcing the key message that they should 'Tell A Grown Up' in these instances. The website is divided into sections for 4-5 and 6-7 year olds and features relevant and age-appropriate games for the chosen age bracket. Each game focuses on one of four topics:

- watching videos
- chatting online
- sharing pictures
- gaming online
