Dear Parents / Carers,

The children have had a super first week back at school. They have settled back into routines very well and there has been a lovely, purposeful atmosphere in school.

Like you all, we, as a school community, are deeply saddened by the death of the Queen last Thursday and, through this period of national mourning, we are talking with the children about the Queen's life and her dedication to the country and the Commonwealth as well as discussing their own thoughts and feelings. We are all very aware of the significance of the past few days and coming weeks as a marker in history and as you will know, next Monday is the State Funeral of Queen Elizabeth II and school will be closed on the 19th September, re-opening on Tuesday 20th September.

Class News:

Every week the classes will share the highlights of what they have been learning about with our families:

EYFS: This week EYFS have enjoyed seeing old friends and building relationships with new friends. We have been learning how to play co-operatively with others and access the different areas of learning effectively. We are beginning to learn how to manage self-care and routines.

Year 1 and 2: In Year 1/2 we have had a fabulous first week with the children settling in and getting to know each other. We have begun to explore the story of Daisy and her Dragons. It's all about Daisy's emotions and how sometimes our emotions overwhelm us and the opposite emotion gets a little lost for a while and what we can do to change how we feel. We have also begun our Maths topic on Number and Place value with lots of counting and sorting. The children have taken part in throwing and catching activities and dance. It has been a very busy week!

Year 3 and 4: We have had a wonderful first week in Year 3/4! We have been learning to write acrostic poems, reading a story as part of PSHE and learning about place value in maths. In



Geography we started our new topic Animals including humans and learned about the digestive system.

Year 5 and 6: We have had a wonderful week in year 5/6. We have been learning about role models and what qualities a role model has. We have been researching some famous role models and we will be writing a magazine article all about them. These will go up on display in the school corridor.

Swimming - Year 5 and 6 children - this Wednesday



School swimming will continue to take place at Thirsk swimming pool. **Year 5** and **Year 6 children start on Wednesday 14th September**. Please ensure your child has swimwear, goggles and a towel (named). It is helpful if girls wear socks and not tights on swimming days. Ear-rings must be removed. Due to the layout and number of cubicles at Thirsk swimming baths, some children need to share a cubicle in order to change before and after the lesson. If any parents have

questions or queries about this then please don't hesitate to speak to Mrs Lyon. After Christmas children in Years 3 and 4 will go swimming.

The cost of swimming will be **£5.00 each week**, this still has to paid even if your child misses a swimming lesson as we still have to pay for the bus, pool hire and swimming instructors. Payments must be made on your Parent Pay account. School has heavily subsidised the cost of swimming due to rising prices from the bus company and constraints imposed by Thirsk Pool.

EXTENDED TASKS

Extended tasks are set every half-term, not weekly. These tasks are designed to incorporate many skills and aim for high quality pieces of work throughout the year. The class teacher will always ensure the hand in time for the extended task is made clear.



<u>Reading</u>

All children need to read at home every day. Please listen to your child read and ask them questions about the text and / or pictures. Please ensure that you record what your child has read and how they have managed with their reading in their record book. Reading and record books need to be in school every day so that they can be checked and new books issued.

<u>PE</u>

Please ensure that your child has their PE kit in school every day. The kit is a plain white t-shirt, navy / black shorts and trainers. As the weather turns colder, a plain navy or black tracksuit can be worn and I would also recommend a lightweight waterproof jacket. PE can take place in most weathers outside if children have the correct clothing!


AWARDS
