Class News:

Every week the classes will share the highlights of what they have been learning about with our families:

EYFS: This week EYFS enjoyed a special visit from Mrs Crabtree our school chef. The children found out about how she helps us within our school community. They asked her some interesting questions. The children made some delicious biscuits which Mrs Crabtree baked for them in the school kitchen. They used maths skills to carefully measure out the ingredients. Then sequenced pictures of their baking to describe the instructions they followed. The children are continuing to retell the story of the Little Red Hen using story maps and actions.

Year 1 and 2: This week year 1/2 have been writing character descriptions of The Tear Thief we have used expanded noun phrases to add interest and excitement into their writing. We have made simple pinch pots out of clay in art and explore which surface caused the least amount of friction in Science. We have continued to explore toys from the past in History. The children have also been learning the algorithm in computing to make the Beebots move.

Year 3 and 4: This week we have been continuing to explore recount texts and looking at the features of recount texts. In Geography we have been learning to read maps using grid references to locate facilities and places. In art we have been preparing our printing blocks to create our William Morris block prints, and in French we have been learning what different names mean.

Year 5 and 6: This week, in year 5/6, we have been finding out about how our food gets to our plate. We have been researching food miles and the journey that is involved in getting different foods to the UK. We are aiming to write some poetry with our findings. We also began exploring using acrylic paints this week in our sketching books. We enjoyed using a different type of paint and we will go on to try using a palette knife to create texture to our painting.

Black History Month

In the UK, October marks the beginning of Black History Month. This national celebration aims to promote and celebrate the contributions of those with African and Caribbean heritage to society and to foster an understanding of Black history in general. Through Black History Month, we learn so much about ourselves and our abilities to overcome challenges both big and small. We learn to reason and wonder about things morally. We also learn from mistakes people made in the past and learn the importance of treating others with compassion – we learn to be givers and helpers. Through this month we are using a number of assemblies to learn about significant people in history such as Dr Martin Luther King, Mary Seacole and Rosa Parks.























Stone Age Workshop - Year 3 and 4

On Friday afternoon, Year 3/4 were transported back into the Stone Age with Una, who came to speak to us about Stone Age life and customs. The children dressed in animal skin clothing, ground grain to make flour using Stone Age tools and were able to examine spears, animal skins, antlers and jewellery from the Stone Age period. The workshop provided a brilliant opportunity for the children to experience first-hand many aspects of Stone Age life we have been studying through the term. We all thoroughly enjoyed in afternoon in the Stone Age!







Poetry Workshop - Year 5 and 6

We had a lovely afternoon with Andy who came to deliver a poetry workshop for year 5/6. The children have written some poems about the queen from different perspectives. Some children have written as the Queen's corgis, her bag, her broach, and even her wardrobe. We hope to share some of our poems in the service at Ripon Cathedral.

Forest Schools – after half term

All the children in school will be undertaking Forest Schools at some point through the academic year. Forest School is an inspiring process which is a specialised approach that aims to develop confidence and self-esteem through hands-on learning outside.

Children in **Year 1 and 2** are going to be undertaking Forest Schools after half term on a Tuesday starting on Tuesday 1st November. Please can children bring into school a waterproof coat, tracksuit bottoms and trainers / wellies – something that you don't mind getting wet and dirty!!
