Dear Parents / Carers,

## **Class News:**

Every week the classes will share the highlights of what they have been learning about with our families:

**EYFS:** This week EYFS have been superstars. They performed the most magical nativity. We were so proud of their performance in front of an audience. EYFS have been getting into the festive spirit and have decorated the classroom to reflect our theme, Christmas. They have been writing letters to Santa and learning about the Christmas story.

**Year 1 and 2:** This week Year 1/2 have been busy perfecting our Nativity "It's a Baby". The children have been amazing at remembering their lines, songs and dances and we cannot be prouder of all of them and their achievements. Well done to all of you.

**Year 3 and 4:** This week we have enjoyed taking part in a football tournament with the year 3 and 4 children at Dishforth Village. We all played well within our teams and had lots of fun. We have also























been learning about conductors and insulators in Science and have been continuing our musical skills on the glockenspiels in our music lessons.

Children in Reception are going to be undertaking Forest Schools this half term on a Tuesday. Please can children bring into school a waterproof coat, tracksuit bottoms and trainers / wellies – something that you don't mind getting wet and dirty!!

# Swimming Year 3 and 4 - January



School swimming will continue to take place at Thirsk swimming pool. **Year 3** and **Year 4** children start on **Wednesday 11**<sup>th</sup> **January**. Please ensure your child has swimwear, goggles and a towel (named). It is helpful if girls wear socks and not tights on swimming days. Due to the layout and number of cubicles at Thirsk swimming baths, some children need to share a cubicle in order to change before and after the lesson. If any parents have questions or queries about this

then please don't hesitate to speak to Mrs Lyon.























The cost of swimming will be £5.00 each week. Payments are through Parent Pay. School has subsidised the cost of swimming due to rising prices from the bus company and constraints imposed by Thirsk Pool.

# Reading

All children need to read at home every day. Please listen to your child read and ask them questions about the text and / or pictures. Please ensure that you record what your child has read and how they have managed with their reading in their record book. Reading and record books need to be in school every day so that they can be checked and new books issued.

## **School Dinners**

The price for dinner is £2.75 per meal (£13.75 per week). The cost for the month of December is £33.00.

#### **Packed Lunches**

A polite reminder that there should be no sweets or chocolate bars in packed lunches or fizzy drinks. Also, we are a **NUT FREE SCHOOL**. We do have children with allergies to nuts so please refrain from any sort of nut products in packed lunches – thank you.

#### **Emergency Procedure for School Closure – weather related / loss of utilities**

It is rare, however there are occasions where it has been necessary to close schools because of inclement weather, no electricity or because of lack of heating, so I would like to bring to your attention the procedures I will follow if this event occurs now that we are heading towards winter:

- · An email will be sent to all families
- County Hall will be informed.

Hopefully, this will not happen this winter but I feel it is better to be prepared.

Please always assume school is open unless you hear via any of the above methods. Please do not phone the school to ask if we are open as we may need to keep the line clear in order to contact staff. Please check on the school Facebook page and check emails. Learning would be sent home via the class email system.
