Dear Parents / Carers,

I hope you have all had a lovely weekend.

Class News:

Every week the classes will share the highlights of what they have been learning about with our families:

EYFS: This week in EYFS we have been settling in with some 'getting to know you' games as we have welcomed our new children and staff into Nursery. We have been learning our new routines and as the weather is chilly, we have been trying hard to be independent when we are getting ready to go outside. We have also been discussing and drawing pictures of what we did during our time off in the last two weeks. Reception have been using the sounds they learnt last term to write words and captions to go with their pictures.

Year 1 and 2: This week Year 1/2 have begun to learn about the exploration Ernest Shackleton. They have explored some different artefacts that were used during the expeditions. We have looked at and explore The Weddell Sea and how the ice looks and feels. As part of our LORIC learning we will be learning to organise ourselves and our belongings - so please support this at home too.

Year 3 and 4: This week, Year 3 and 4 have been learning about cats in factual and fictional texts as they started their class novel Varjak Paw and began researching different cat breeds. In PSHE and RE the children considered what makes a community and how the golden rule of treating others as you want to be treated can make everyone's life a little better. They also began learning the Bob Marley song 3 Little Birds, were introduced to the sculptor Barbara Hepworth and learned about the names of different fruits in French. Not bad for a three-day week!



Year 5 and 6: This week we have been writing letters to the year 5/6 children at Dishforth Village Primary School. We are hoping to become pen pals with them and find out more about them. We have written informal letters with information about ourselves and questions to ask them. We look forward to getting a reply!

Year 5/6 World War 2 Launch Day

Year 5 and 6 children have stepped back in time. Today we had our topic launch day and we all came dressed up as evacuees. We have spent the day learning all about evacuation, we started our new class text 'Goodnight Mr Tom' and we also had our first history lesson on World War 2. We learnt some key dates and the countries that were involved.

Swimming Year 3 and 4 – January – this Wednesday



School swimming will continue to take place at Thirsk swimming pool. **Year 3** and **Year 4 children start on Wednesday 11th January**. Please ensure your child has swimwear, goggles and a towel (named). It is helpful if girls wear socks and not tights on swimming days. Due to the layout and number of cubicles at Thirsk swimming baths, some children need to share a cubicle in order to change before and after the lesson. If any parents have questions or queries about this

then please don't hesitate to speak to Mrs Lyon. The cost of swimming will be **£5.00 each week.** Payments are through Parent Pay. School has subsidised the cost of swimming due to rising prices from the bus company and constraints imposed by Thirsk Pool.

School Dinners

The price for dinner is £2.95 per meal (£14.75 per week). The cost for the month of January is **£59.00.**

Packed Lunches

A polite reminder that there should be no sweets or chocolate bars in packed lunches or fizzy drinks. Also, we are a **NUT FREE SCHOOL**. We do have children with allergies to nuts so please refrain from any sort of nut products in packed lunches – thank you.

Emergency Procedure for School Closure – weather related / loss of utilities
