

Dear Parents / Carers,

This week in school we are celebrating World Book Day on Thursday where the children can come dressed up as a character from a book. In addition to this we also have our World Book Day promotional school lunch based on Roald Dahl's 'Charlie and the Chocolate Factory'.

Class News:

Every week the classes will share the highlights of what they have been learning about with our families:

EYFS: This week in Early Years we have begun our new topic, Amazing Africa. As it was also Pancake Day on Tuesday, we read a traditional tale from Kenya called Mama Panya's Pancakes by Mary and Rich Chamberlin. Afterwards, we made pancakes with the same ingredients as Mama Panya which included nutmeg and cardamom. Some of us really liked them! We came back after half term and the beans we planted have grown very green and tall. Now the weather is warmer, we are looking forward to doing lots of planting in our outdoor area in the coming weeks.

Year 1 and 2: In Year 1/2 we have been super scientists, finding out about the different materials that things have been made from. "Commander Classify" has helped us to organise objects into different groups and then we went on our own hunt to find our won objects to classify. In history we have been learning about the different equipment that Ernest Shackleton and his crew took on the Endurance expedition. They lived on a diet of pemmican. On the label it says that Pemmican is "A highly sustaining food consisting of Albumen and Fibrene of Beef and Animal Fat" This was mixed with biscuits and water. It sounds really disgusting! We are glad we have Mrs Crabtree!

Year 3 and 4: This week, Year 3 - 4 have begun to learn about different states of matter in science and putting their knowledge to practical use as they began to explore the forms they will need to create in clay when they make their own sculptures later this term. They have been researching the





















effects of climate change and the importance of Fairtrade to those who are most affected as they have begun to think about arguments for a persuasive letter.

Year 5 and 6: In year 5/6 this week we have started our new science topic of 'Light'. We have been learning about how we see objects and how light reflects. We learnt about the incident ray and the reflected ray. We are moving on to look at refraction next week!

Year 3 / 4 children have been learning about the modernist sculptor Barbara Hepworth who created works using stone, wood and bronze which represented people in relation to the natural landscape. Year 3 and 4 children will be undertaking an artist led visit which will allow children to see some of the key sculptures in the park and then make their own creations under the artist's guidance.

Year 5 / 6 children have been learning about Larry Lerew, an artist who uses wax crayons and a water colour wash to create wonderful paintings. Year 5 / 6 children are going to take equipment, and paint some landscapes at the Yorkshire Sculpture Park.
