I hope you all had a lovely weekend and enjoyed the milder weather. Just a reminder that school clubs have finished for the term and new clubs will be on offer after the Easter Holidays.

Thank you to everyone who supported Comic Relief on Friday – as a school we raised £75.00

Class News:

Every week the classes will share the highlights of what they have been learning about with our families:

EYFS: This week we have been thinking about our mummies and what they do to help us every day. We have made special cards to say thank you so we hope you all had a lovely Mother's Day! In Maths, we have been learning how to use a balance scale and compare objects, describing which are heavier and lighter. We have also been learning about what plants need to survive and how they 'drink' water. We investigated where a cactus stores water as part of our Africa topic. We have remembered to water the vegetable seedlings for our outdoor area and they are now growing nicely.

Year 1 and 2: This week Year 1/2 have been learning how to shape and finished their DT project -Wheeled vehicles - they are beginning to take shape and form. We have continued without printing in Art and have create a second colour ready for the final top print next week. We have been learning how to solve problems using all four operations in Maths and have continued to be authors in English writing our own stories. The children loved having time with the animals on Friday afternoon.

Year 3 and 4: This week we have been busy writing biographies about famous artist Barbara Hepworth and we are looking forward to seeing some of her sculptures on our trip next week! In Science we have enjoyed setting up a fair test to observe what happens to different liquids when they are cooled and we were very surprised with some of the results. In our computing lessons, we



have been developing our knowledge of garage band and we have been using live loops to create our own songs on the app.

Year 5 and 6: This week we have been writing an explanation text for Wallace and Gromit. We found out that they had lost their invention book and needed help to write up one of their inventions. We have written an explanation text for the Snoozatron which is a machine that helps you get to sleep.

Aquatic Finatic

The children in Years 1-6 enjoyed a visit from Aquatic Finatic on Friday where they saw a wide range of animals including an owl, lizard, chinchilla, snake and a rabbit.

Key Stage 2 Trip to Yorkshire Sculpture Park – tomorrow

Tomorrow all of Key Stage 2 are visiting the Yorkshire Sculpture Park for the day which looks like it will be a wonderful day enhancing the superb art work which has been covered in school.

Year 3 / 4 children have been learning about the modernist sculptor Barbara Hepworth who created works using stone, wood and bronze which represented people in relation to the natural landscape. Year 3 and 4 children will be undertaking an artist led visit which will allow children to see some of the key sculptures in the park and then make their own creations under the artist's guidance.

Year 5 / 6 children have been learning about Larry Lerew, an artist who uses wax crayons and a water colour wash to create wonderful paintings. Year 5 / 6 children are going to take equipment, and paint some landscapes at the Yorkshire Sculpture Park.
