Dear Parents / Carers.

I hope you all had a super weekend and enjoyed lovely autumn sunshine yesterday. It is a busy time in school as we seem to be whizzing through the term, therefore the newsletter today covers quite a bit of forthcoming events to help with planning for the festive season ahead.

Thank you to everyone who supported both the school disco last Thursday and Children in Need on Friday - we are in the process of counting the money raised!

On another note, thank you to everyone who supported the Poppy Appeal - £127 was raised by the school.

#### Last week of clubs

Just a reminder that this week is the last week of clubs run by school staff. The multi-skills club which is run by Sporting Influence will continue until Monday 11<sup>th</sup> December. A new set of clubs will be on offer to the children after Christmas. Thank you to all the staff who have given up their time this term to run the clubs.

#### **Class News:**

Every week the classes will share the highlights of what they have been learning about with our families:

**EYFS:** In Early Years this week we have designed our very own planet. This allowed us to use our imaginations and prompted lots of discussion about what features we would have. We had some great suggestions such as a planet made out of chocolate and a planet where everything is made out of Lego. We have been focussing on number bonds to 5 and learning how we can split 5 into two parts. We learnt how a part and a part makes a whole which is the total amount. In provision this





















week we have been focussing on having a purpose in mind when we are creating models. This has involved us designing, making and then going back to our model to evaluate and add to.

**Year 1 and 2:** This week Year 1/2 have been exploring the story called 'The Invisible' and are learning to use description skills to explain what is happening in the story. In Maths we have been practicing to take away on a number line for year 1 and exchange ones for tens in year 2 - it's very tricky! We have begun our final piece of art work and have some amazing art inspired by Pablo Picasso. We have also begun our dance and song in preparation for our Nativity show! So, it's been a very busy week.

**Year 3 and 4:** This week we have continued writing our own time travel stories in English and we have been particularly focusing on including lots of detail and description. In DT we have started to make our very own mazes using our new woodwork skills - we are looking forward to seeing these come together into our final project. In PE, we have been continuing to develop our tag rugby and gymnastic skills.

**Year 5 and 6:** In Year 5/6 this week we have been learning about the earth. We were looking at evidence to support why the earth is spherical and why, in the past, some people have thought the earth was different shapes. We analysed the evidence for each opinion. We have also written a newspaper about the discovery of a Maya temple which is link to our class text. We thought about eye witnesses to the event and how people may feel as a result of this discovery.

#### Scholar Pack - Parent App - message from Mrs Watts

We are delighted to inform you that we are now using Scholar Pack Parents App.

This app will give you up-to-date information about your child's attendance, reporting absence and your contact details, as well as receiving message directly from school.

Firstly, you will need to download the app onto your phone by searching 'Scholar pack Parents' in the Google Play store or the Apple App store. Once downloaded, you will need to enter a linkup code when setting up. You should have received an email last week containing your link up code. If you didn't receive this, please ask the office to resend you the link up code.

#### **Scholar Pack - Comms**

We are no longer sending emails from Parent Pay, emails will be sent to you directly from Scholar pack, our new online messaging system.

Parent Pay will still be used for billing purposes and you will continue to use as normal. There are a few links on the Parent App that are very useful. If you select school details, you can see the links. Parent Pay is on there, if you login, it will give you direct access.

#### Good attendance at school is key to your child's progress.

Good attendance is essential for pupils to get the most out of their school experience, including their attainment, wellbeing, and wider life chances. Nationwide research has shown that the pupils with the highest attainment at the end of key stage 2 have had higher rates of attendance throughout primary school, compared to those with the lowest attainment. The government aims for all pupils to have a minimum of 95% attendance across the school year, and any child with less than 90% attendance is recorded as a persistent absentee.
