Dear Parents / Carers,

I hope you have all had a lovely weekend and the children have managed to enjoy some time in the snow!

We have a busy week in school this week with our High 5 netball team who are playing in the finals at Ashville College, Harrogate tomorrow – good luck! Also, the EYFS Nativity is on Wednesday morning at 10am in the school hall and on Friday we are supporting Christmas Jumper Day for 'Save the Children' where the children can come to school wearing a Christmas Jumper for a donation of $\pounds1$.

Class News:

Every week the classes will share the highlights of what they have been learning about with our families:

EYFS: This week we have had a very busy week preparing for our Nativity. We have learnt the 'Christmas story' and rehearsed our Nativity songs. Everybody is putting in so much effort which is lovely to see. We have also been exploring the weather outdoors and creating ice by leaving trays of water overnight. The children have enjoyed seeing the results in the morning and have exploring heating the ice so it melts. In maths we have been finding one less by taking one away. The children have explored making different sized towers making sure they have one less each time.

Year 1 and 2: This week Year 1/2 have been working really hard on their acting and dancing skills ready for their nativity. We have been learning about 2D and 3D shapes this week and their prosperities. We have evaluated our final art work in the cubist style of Pablo Picasso and have been exploring artefacts and life in the past. In ICT we have been using an app called book creator to create our own eBooks.

Year 3 and 4: This week we have been working hard on our DT and Art skills. We have enjoyed making our own mazes in DT using our woodwork skills and we have been developing our shading skills in art in preparation for starting our final piece. In English, we have been using our geography



knowledge to begin planning our river journey writing, paying close attention to key vocabulary and generating exciting adjectives and similes. In PE, we have continued to practice our tag rugby technique and we have been learning how to do cartwheels and handstands in gymnastics. A very busy week indeed!

Year 5 and 6: This week we have begun to create our final doll design in DT and Art. We have used wire to create the frame and then chicken wire to wrap around the original structure. We are then going to use mod roc to cover the figure and then decorate it! The children have worked really carefully with the new equipment that we have been using and have shown resilience during the project so far.

Swimming Year 3 and 4 – January



School swimming will continue to take place at Thirsk swimming pool. **Year 3 and Year 4 children start on Wednesday 10th January**. Please ensure your child has swimwear, goggles and a towel (named). It is helpful if girls wear socks and not tights on swimming days. Due to the layout and number of cubicles at Thirsk swimming baths, some children need to share a cubicle in order to change before and after the lesson. If any parents have questions or queries about this

then please don't hesitate to speak to Mrs Lyon.

The cost of swimming will be **£5.00 each week.** Payments are through Parent Pay. School has subsidised the cost of swimming due to rising prices from the bus company and constraints imposed by Thirsk Pool.

Emergency Procedure for School Closure – weather related / loss of utilities

It is rare, however there are occasions where it has been necessary to close schools because of inclement weather, no electricity or because of lack of heating, so I would like to bring to your attention the procedures I will follow if this event occurs now that we are heading towards winter:
