Dear Parents / Carers,

We had a very productive first week back in school last week with new topics started.

It looks like we are in for quite a cold spell this week - I reminded the children on Friday to be finding and wearing their hats and gloves in preparation!

## **Class News:**

Every week the classes will share the highlights of what they have been learning about with our families:

**EYFS:** What an excellent week we have had for our first week of 2024! We have been learning all about penguins through our story 'The penguin who lost his way'. We have learnt where penguin's live, what they look like and how penguin's keep themselves safe during harsh weather conditions. We created a penguin huddle, worked with a partner to create a penguin and made burrows/nooks using a range of materials. In maths Nursery have been learning how to subitise 3 playing a game of games and Reception have been learning how to find one less by crossing out or counting back.

**Year 1 and 2:** In year 1/2 this week we have been learning about a girl called Seima who lives in a floating house on a lake in Cambodia. This is a story based on real life events. We have used Google Earth to zoom in and see the actual floating village which was amazing. The children loved making telephones using cups and strings - but they only work if the string is pulled tight! In Maths we have been learning to recognise equal groups in Year 2 and counting on from a given number in Year 1. We have also begun to learn about the continents in Geography and the song which tells us all 7 continents in size order!

**Year 3 and 4:** This week we have really enjoyed starting our new whole class reading book, 'The Firework-Maker's Daughter' - we have been busy exploring the different characters. In Art, we have started to explore the work of Henry Moore and we are looking forward to developing our skills to create a final piece inspired by his artwork created during World War II. In DT, we have been





















exploring levers and linkages, looking closely at prototypes to understand how they work so that we are able to make our own mechanisms to crate moving story books.

**Year 5 and 6:** We have had a great first week back in year 5/6! We have started our PE lessons with Sporting influence where we had a gymnastic session. We also started our class text 'The Wolf Wilder' in our English lessons which is a wonderful story about a girl living in Russia! We look forward to seeing what she gets up to!

The cost of swimming will be £5.00 each week. Payments are through Parent Pay. School has subsidised the cost of swimming due to rising prices from the bus company and constraints imposed by Thirsk Pool.

#### Clubs

#### Emergency Procedure for School Closure – weather related / loss of utilities

Please ensure that you record what your child has read and how they have managed with their reading in their record book. Reading and record books need to be in school every day so that they can be checked and new books issued.

Miss Rachel Hunt is back at Dishforth Airfield Primary School as our Forest School teacher for this year! Forest Schools will take place on a Monday afternoon for the full afternoon for three weeks for each class at some point in the year.

Here is a message from Miss Hunt:

Hello! I am delighted to be able to deliver Forest School sessions to all year groups over the course of the 2023 - 24 academic year. Forest School is child led, outdoor learning where children can learn a variety of skills from wood craft to fire lighting and challenge themselves to take risks whilst learning to respect and care for the natural world around them.

You can expect your child to get messy as we will be outdoors in all weathers so, please make sure that they bring clothes for every weather for every session. Ideally: wellies or walking boots; waterproof jacket and trousers or all in ones and a sun hat or woolly hat dependent on the temperature. I will provide safety gloves, but warm preferably waterproof gloves should be sent in the colder months.

Year 5 and 6 will have Forest Schools first on Monday 15<sup>th</sup>, 22<sup>nd</sup> and 29<sup>th</sup> January in the afternoon. Please bring the outdoor clothing and footwear above in a named bag.
