### Class News:

Every week the classes will share the highlights of what they have been learning about with our families:

**EYFS:** This week we have been learning all about the jungle and finding out facts about jungle animals. We have watched 'Rumble in the Jungle' which we have used musical instruments to create the sounds of the jungle. We have explored creating jungle small world scenes in provision, which has required us to think carefully about what the animals might need for food and shelter. We have





















also been learning about 2D and 3D shapes in maths and sorting them by their properties e.g. curved and straight sides.

**Year 1 and 2:** This week Year ½ have been practicing writing in sentences. We know we need a capital letter finger spaces and a full stop and we have been trying really hard with our handwriting. In Maths we have been learning about mass - recognising whether an object is heavier or lighter. In DT we have evaluated our DT structures and have learnt about the artifacts linked to Easter.

**Year 3 and 4:** This week we have been developing our writing skills in preparation for writing our final firework display description next week. We have also enjoyed starting our final pieces in art using charcoal and chalk to create drawings in the style of Henry Moore. In Geography we have been using grid references to identify locations on maps and we have been learning about the impacts of earthquakes and the hazards that they can cause.

**Year 5 and 6:** This week in year 5/6 we have been finishing our DT projects. We have research, designed and create a structure or shelter and this week we made them using wood. The children really impressed us with their attitude toward this project where they learnt new skills using hack saws and glue guns. The final projects turned out really well and our evaluations of the success of the project were very useful.

Good attendance is essential for pupils to get the most out of their school experience, including their attainment, wellbeing, and wider life chances. Nationwide research has shown that the pupils with the highest attainment at the end of key stage 2 have had higher rates of attendance throughout primary school, compared to those with the lowest attainment. The government aims for all pupils to have a minimum of 95% attendance across the school year, and any child with less than 90% attendance is recorded as a persistent absentee.
