Dear Parents / Carers,

I hope you have all had a lovely weekend. We have had a very productive first week back in school after the Easter break and we have much to look forward to this week with the skipping / boxercise workshop today, Year 5 and 6 have a lino cutting workshop on Wednesday followed by class photographs on Thursday morning and Year 3 and 4 going to the theatre on Thursday afternoon!

I have added some further information to the diary dates at the end of the newsletter – please keep checking these as they will be added to on a regular basis.

#### Class News:

Every week the classes will share the highlights of what they have been learning about with our families:

**EYFS:** In Early years we have been exploring the story 'What the Ladybird Heard" by Julia Donaldson. This is a brilliant story for exploring life on a farm and animal sounds even though there is a bit of a commotion. The children have enjoyed watching videos about ducklings hatching and have written fantastic sentences about them. To help develop our 'Understanding of the World' we have been thinking about our pasts and what is happening now. The children good give great examples of when they were babies and toddlers and what they used to do. The children have also enjoyed looking after our outdoor area it has been lovely to see our plants and vegetables have started to grow over the holidays.

**Year 1 and 2:** This week the children in Year ½ have come back to school with a fantastic attitude to learning. we have been learning to write a recount and have focused this around the workshop about the Great Fire of London. We have started new topics in Maths - Year 1 Multiplication and Division 0 counting in 2's and 10's and Year 2 have begun a topic on Fractions - looking at parts and whole. In RE we are looking at the features of Christianity and what and how they celebrate. We are looking forward to starting are Art and DT topics!



**Year 3 and 4:** This week we have been starting lots of new focuses of learning across the curriculum. We were really excited to find out that our new artist study is about LS Lowry and we enjoyed exploring his artwork and the specific colours and techniques he used in his work. In geography we have been learning about the differences between countries, counties and cities and we are looking forward to finding out more about these over the term.

**Year 5 and 6:** We have had a great first week back in year 5/6! We have started our new class text and we are GRIPPED! It is linked to our class history topic 'The Vikings' and it has us hooked from the first chapter. We have also begun to investigate global trade and how our goods are transported and imported from all over the world.

## PE Workshop

Today the children took part in a PE workshop at some point during the school day focusing on both skipping skills and boxercise skills. All the children really enjoyed the workshop.









## Year 3 and 4 Theatre Trip – this Thursday

On Thursday, Year 3 and 4 will be going to Newcastle Theatre Royal to watch a performance of The Wizard of Oz. The children will eat lunch early and we anticipate arriving back to school around 6.30pm.

## Forest Schools – starting Wednesday this week for Reception Children

Miss Rachel Hunt is back at Dishforth Airfield Primary School as our Forest School teacher for this year! Forest Schools will take place on a Monday afternoon for the full afternoon for three weeks for each class at some point in the year.

Here is a message from Miss Hunt:

Hello! I am delighted to be able to deliver Forest School sessions to all year groups over the course of the 2023 - 24 academic year. Forest School is child led, outdoor learning where children can learn a variety of skills from wood craft to fire lighting and challenge themselves to take risks whilst learning to respect and care for the natural world around them.

You can expect your child to get messy as we will be outdoors in all weathers so, please make sure that they bring clothes for every weather for every session. Ideally: wellies or walking boots;



waterproof jacket and trousers or all in ones and a sun hat or woolly hat dependent on the temperature. I will provide safety gloves, but warm preferably waterproof gloves should be sent in the colder months.

Reception children will have Forest Schools on Wednesday this week (due to the wind which is forecast today), Monday 22<sup>nd</sup> and 29<sup>th</sup> April in the afternoon. Please bring the outdoor clothing and footwear above in a named bag.

## Growing Up in North Yorkshire Survey

Since 2006, every two years, schools in North Yorkshire are invited to take part in a Health and Wellbeing survey. There are surveys for different age groups and, in our school, Year 2/3 and Year 5/6 children participate. The information is used by school and also at County level.
