Word Classes



The words that we use when writing can be organised into different 'word classes'.

It is important that we know the names of these different types of words and the job/s that they have in a sentence.

- Nouns are the names of things, objects, people and places (e.g. chair, Newry, Simon, rabbit). In sentences, the person or thing performing an action can also be known as the subject.
- Verbs can describe an action (e.g. sing, climb), emotion (e.g. loves, hates), thought (e.g. thinks), opinion (e.g. believes) or state of being (e.g. am, is, are, was, were).
- Adjectives are words that describe nouns (e.g. delicious meal, fragrant flower, four buttons).

In these sentences colour the nouns **blue**, the verbs **red** and the adjectives **green**.

2. Cats are good at smelling, hearing and seeing in the dark.
3. The rain fell for hours on the cold ground.
4. The sharp nail pricked my little finger.
