Dear Parents / Carers,

I hope you all enjoyed the long weekend – it would seem that the weather is turning a corner with hopefully some warm, dry days ahead!

Sun Cream

Please can I ask parents to ensure the children have sun cream applied to them before they come to school in the morning when the forecast is due to be sunny and also, please do send into school a bottle of sun cream labelled with your child's name on it so that they can apply it, when necessary, over the summer months – thank you.

Class News:

Every week the classes will share the highlights of what they have been learning about with our families:

EYFS: We have had a lovely time getting outdoors in the sunshine this week. We have been watching our vegetables grow even though we think there may be a sneaky caterpillar munching on the leaves. We have learnt all about the life cycle of a butterfly and created a life cycle in our 'understanding the world' focus time. We have used digital microscopes to look at creatures we have found in our digging area looking at their features up close.

Year 1 and 2: This week Year 1 / 2 have been learning all about Fractions - we've been learning to share into half, quarters and thirds both shapes and numbers. In Design Technology we have completed technical drawings of fruit and labelled the different parts. We have also started a bird watch in our learning garden using an app to identify the different bird songs. In art we have explored the water colour paints and blended two primary colours together to make a secondary colour.





















Year 3 and 4: This week we have been really enjoying continuing to read our class text, 'Charlie and the Chocolate Factory'. We have been practicing reading with intonation and have made inferences about characters thoughts and feelings throughout the story so far. We were excited to find golden tickets left for us earlier this week along with an advert for a very new chocolate factory! We have since been busy designing and generating language to describe our own chocolate factories which we will be writing adverts for in the coming weeks.

Year 5 and 6: This week we have been learning about each function of the circulatory system. We investigate the purpose of the heart, lunch and blood vessel and the important roll each of these plays in keeping blood and oxygen moving around our bodies. We also began some research on the different aspect of Viking life. We use primary and secondary sources to find out information about categories such as houses, weapons, food and clothing.

Year 5 and 6 Residential to High Adventure – Parent Information Session

National Curriculum Assessments at the end of Key Stage 1 and 2

Key Stage 2 Assessments – Year 6

Week commencing the 13th May, children in Year 6 are taking national curriculum tests in English grammar, punctuation and spelling, English reading and mathematics. The tests help measure the progress pupils have made and identify if they need additional support in a certain area. The tests are also used to assess schools' performance and to produce national performance data. At the end of the summer term the test results will be reported in: • English grammar, punctuation and spelling • English reading and Mathematics.

Teacher assessment: As there is no test for English writing, this will be reported as a teacher assessment judgement. This is a judgement the teacher will make, based on the child's work at the end of key stage 2. Parents will also receive a teacher assessment judgement for science.

Year 1 Phonic Screen Check

Children in Year 1 will take the phonic screen check during the period week commencing 10th June. The outcome of this check is reported to parents by the end of the summer term.





















Year 4 Multiplication Check

Children in Year 4 will take the national multiplication check in June during a two-week window commencing on the 3rd June. The outcome of this check is reported to parents by the end of the summer term. Please refer to the parent / carer information document which is attached to this newsletter.

On Tuesday 21st May the children in Year 3 and 4 will be visiting Ripon in the morning to undertake some geography fieldwork activities.

Start small, dream big - careers project for Year 4 and 5 children

We are delighted that our school has been selected to take part in an exciting pilot programme to improve careers education in primary schools across England.

This pilot programme is being run by your local <u>Careers Hub</u>, funded by <u>The Careers & Enterprise Company</u> and evaluated in partnership with <u>ImpactEd Evaluation</u>. ImpactEd Evaluation is an independent evaluator that supports high-quality monitoring and evaluation in schools.

To fully evaluate the impact of the programme on pupils and parents, we will be inviting **Year 4 and 5 children** to complete a short survey in school which will ask questions about behaviours, attitudes and beliefs related to careers and the world of work. They will complete this in April/May 2024, and next academic year in April/May 2025.

We will also be inviting parents of all children in school to complete a survey about your behaviours, attitudes and beliefs related to careers towards the end of the year (April/May 2025).

These surveys will help understand the impact of the project so that it can be improved it in the future.

Any data shared in the surveys will be treated confidentially and no identifiable information will be included within the reporting. Only aggregate findings and trends will be published. Weekly Attendance

Good attendance at school is key to your child's progress.

Good attendance is essential for pupils to get the most out of their school experience, including their attainment, wellbeing, and wider life chances. Nationwide research has shown that the pupils with the highest attainment at the end of key stage 2 have had higher rates of attendance throughout primary school, compared to those with the lowest attainment. The government aims for all pupils to have a minimum of 95% attendance across the school year, and any child with less than 90% attendance is recorded as a persistent absentee.
