Newsletter 33 3rd June 2024

I hope you all had a fantastic week off school and enjoyed some sunshine over the weekend!

We have a busy half term ahead as we move towards the end of the academic year with many things to look forward to – please keep checking diary dates at the end of the newsletter.

### **Class News:**

Every week the classes will share the highlights of what they have been learning about with our families:

**EYFS:** This week we had a lovely, exciting fun filled morning with the Story Craft theatre. The children were very active in their story telling session based on fairy tales. We experienced travelling on a storytelling rocket, meeting Little Red Riding Hood the detective in the forest and hunting for Goldilocks. This has all tied in brilliantly with our 'making a house for Goldilocks' theme in Reception and making Goldilocks moving puppets in Nursery.

**Year 1 and 2:** This week Year 1 / 2 started the week with the Story Craft Theatre - the children loved the activities and performance. We have been writing our own version of the Lighthouse Keeper's Lunch story this week starting with our perfect writing and then using the skills we have learn over the last two weeks. In Maths we have been learning to tell the time to and past the hour in 5-minute intervals and we have been learning position and direction - left, right, forwards and backwards. In PE we have been learning Tennis and playing dodgeball!

**Year 3 and 4:** We have had a super week. We enjoyed our geography fieldwork trip to Ripon where we put all of our learning and skill development in the classroom into practice. We used maps to plot and follow routes, conducted a traffic survey which we presented as tally and bar charts, did a shop survey of Ripon and drew our own sketch maps of the market place. We have also started designing





















our night lights and the circuits we need to make them work in DT. We are looking forward to making them next half term!

**Year 5 and 6:** This week in year 5/6 we have been taste testing some foods that we may use to create out 3-course meal. We are going to be making afternoon tea with seasonal ingredients. We have tried all sorts of different elements of and afternoon tea and we've started to draft up some recipe ideas. We have also been learning about the effect that different substances can have on our body in our science lesson.

### Year 5 and 6 Residential to High Adventure

We are very much looking forward to taking a group of children from Year 5 /6 to High Adventure on a residential this week. We leave on Wednesday morning and will return to school on Friday afternoon.

### **Passport of Experiences**

A huge thank you to all the families who have sent in further ideas for our Passports of Experiences. We are going through them together this week and will be updating the passports ready for September.

### Forest Schools - Year 1 and 2 - starting next Monday 10<sup>th</sup> June

Miss Rachel Hunt is back at Dishforth Airfield Primary School as our Forest School teacher for this term! Forest Schools will take place on a Monday afternoon for the full afternoon for three weeks for each class at some point in the year.

Here is a message from Miss Hunt:

Hello! I am delighted to be able to deliver Forest School sessions to all year groups over the course of the 2023 - 24 academic year. Forest School is child led, outdoor learning where children can learn a variety of skills from wood craft to fire lighting and challenge themselves to take risks whilst learning to respect and care for the natural world around them.

You can expect your child to get messy as we will be outdoors in all weathers so, please make sure that they bring clothes for every weather for every session. Ideally: wellies or walking boots; waterproof jacket and trousers or all in ones and a sun hat or woolly hat dependent on the temperature. I will provide safety gloves, but warm preferably waterproof gloves should be sent in the colder months.

Year 1 and 2 children will have Forest Schools on Monday 10<sup>th</sup>, 17<sup>th</sup> and 24<sup>th</sup> June in the afternoon. Please bring the outdoor clothing and footwear above in a named bag.























### **Sun Cream**

Please can I ask parents to ensure the children have a **long lasting**, **high SPF sun cream** applied to them before they come to school in the morning when the forecast is due to be sunny and also, please do send into school a bottle of sun cream labelled with your child's name on it so that they can apply it, when necessary, over the summer months – thank you.

## National Curriculum Assessments at the end of Key Stage 1 and 2

### Good attendance at school is key to your child's progress.

Good attendance is essential for pupils to get the most out of their school experience, including their attainment, wellbeing, and wider life chances. Nationwide research has shown that the pupils with the highest attainment at the end of key stage 2 have had higher rates of attendance throughout primary school, compared to those with the lowest attainment. The government aims for all pupils to have a minimum of 95% attendance across the school year, and any child with less than 90% attendance is recorded as a persistent absentee.
