Dear Parents / Carers,

I hope you have all had a super weekend and enjoyed the glorious weather. I am sure you will have seen the forecast for this week and the predicted high temperatures so please can the children all bring sunhats and have a **long lasting**, **high SPF sun cream** applied to them before they come to school as well. Thank you.

We have an incredibly busy few weeks left in school – please read the details of events carefully as some timings may have changed – information regarding Sports Day is also included in this newsletter.

Class News:

Every week the classes will share the highlights of what they have been learning about with our families:

EYFS: This week we have been exploring how to clean water in science using a range of materials as a filter. We made a prediction and soon found out that cotton wool was an excellent material for catching mud and making the water appear clean. The children have enjoyed researching sea creatures, finding out facts and information. We have also been adding to our aquarium in the creative area using a range of attaching and folding techniques.

Year 1 and 2: We've had a busy week in Year 1/2 this week. The children have begun writing their own poems in the style of Grandad's Tomatoes. We have learnt the scientific names for body parts. We had great fun finding the human and physical features of Boroughbridge and visited the fruit shop for a quick snack - thank you to Aarish's family. We have been practicing our athletics skills in PE and had a fantastic - if not a little wet Forest Schools session using the hand drills to make beads, building dens and making gargoyles.



Year 3 and 4: This week we have been writing an information page all about Ripon using our fieldwork experience and research to help us. In maths we have been learning about different types of angles, lines and shapes. In Science we have explored the different types of seed dispersal. We are continuing to make our night lights and are very pleased with how they are looking so far!

Year 5 and 6: This week we have been in full swing with our rehearsals. The children have been amazing - saying lines without their scripts, getting into character, perfecting the dances and working on their acting. I am so proud of all of them and we can't wait to share the performance with you!

Targeted Mainstream Provision consultation

Attached to this newsletter is a consultation document which explains a proposal by North Yorkshire Council to establish an additional Targeted Mainstream Provision (TMP) for Children and Young People with SEND delivered by Dishforth Airfield Primary School.

Following discussions with the Governors and Senior Leaders, Dishforth Airfield Primary School has been selected to deliver an additional Targeted Mainstream Provision. North Yorkshire Council is now asking for your views on this proposal as part of the statutory process which is required before alterations of these kind are made to maintained schools. This is an exciting opportunity for the school where we can utilise our experience and expertise in supporting others - please refer to the document attached.

Year 1 and 2 visit to Boroughbridge

Year One and Two went on a geographical field trip this week. We had fun spotting human and physical features in Boroughbridge and found some interesting things on the way. Did you know that Boroughbridge was the site of a famous battle? Or that there is a collection of historical objects including a mangle, a dolly and a dolly tub? We made a record of the different things we had seen and were lucky to stop off at the fruit and vegetable store, where Aarish's parents made us very welcome and sent us off with goodies. Enormous thanks to them for their kindness and generosity. A member of the public pointed out the swifts flying around and we are going to research them in our next science lesson. We carried on with our walk and tested our science knowledge, looking out for wild and garden plants. We then stopped off at Langthorpe for a short pause and used our knowledge of Ordnance Survey symbols to identify what we had found in the town- there is a lot there! Finally, after a long, hot walk we headed back to the car park and were driven back to school in style by the Boroughbridge Community Charity minibus.

Weekly Attendance

Good attendance at school is key to your child's progress.

Good attendance is essential for pupils to get the most out of their school experience, including their attainment, wellbeing, and wider life chances. Nationwide research has shown that the pupils with the highest attainment at the end of key stage 2 have had higher rates of attendance throughout primary school, compared to those with the lowest attainment. The government aims for all pupils to have a minimum of 95% attendance across the school year, and any child with less than 90% attendance is recorded as a persistent absentee.
