Homework

At our school, we believe that children learn best when parents, the school and children work together in partnership. Home Learning should be a positive experience which is manageable, meaningful and enjoyable for parents, teachers and children.

Reading books will be prioritised this week in school and homework will be sent out on Friday for children in Years 1 - 6. All the details about homework will be in the homework book - please speak to your child's class teacher if you have any questions / queries.





















Reading

All children need to read at home every day. Please listen to your child read and ask them questions about the text and / or pictures. Please ensure that you record what your child has read and how they have managed with their reading in their record book. Reading and record books need to be in school every day so that they can be checked and new books issued.

Early Reading and Phonics Session for Reception Parents

Mrs Hutchinson will be holding a meeting about our phonics scheme, Read Write Inc. on Wednesday 18th September at 2.30pm. All parents of children in Reception need to attend this session please.

Autumn Term Curriculum Class Newsletters

Curriculum Class newsletters which give information about the subjects which are to be taught this term will be sent out to families later this week. The class newsletters will also be uploaded to the school website and will be available for reference for the whole term.

Parents Evening

Parents Evening will be week commencing the 21st October – further details will follow in due course.

Reward System

Our reward system in school is that each class has a jar that will be filled with marbles in Year 1-6 and bugs in a jug in EYFS. Children can be awarded bugs or marbles for following the School's Expectations, working hard and showing good manners. When the jar is full the class can then decide with their teacher which reward they would like.

Celebration Assembly

Every Friday the school gathers together for a Celebration Assembly. This is an opportunity for the children to share something which they have worked on during the week. In addition to this, we also have birthday celebrations, award a ribbon to one child in each class for hard work and hand out a cup to a pupil who has impressed the staff at the school either for their work, attitude or behaviour. The cup is to be returned the following Thursday for the next assembly and the ribbons can be kept. I will publish who has been awarded the cup and ribbon in each newsletter.

We also have a school values award where the children can nominate who is to receive the award. This celebrates the recognition of children carrying out our school values which are: compassion, commitment, co-operation, respect, responsibility and resilience.

Bikes & Scooters

Children are welcome to ride these to school in a safe, considerate manner wearing a helmet. Once they arrive at the school gate, we ask that they dismount at the first gate and then park them in the cycle/scooter rack provided. *They are not to ride them on the school drive or playground at any time for safety reasons – thank you.*





















Collecting children at home time

If you have arranged for another person to collect your child / children from school, then please ensure you have communicated this to the class teacher and / or the office staff otherwise we won't let them leave school!

School Uniform

A reminder about school uniform:

Grey trousers/skirt
Red polo shirt
Navy blue embroidered school sweatshirt or cardigan (branded optional)
Grey/white / black socks
Black school shoes – not trainers

PE kit

White loose plain T-shirt (no logos)
Blue or black plain shorts (no logos)
Plimsolls or trainers plus a spare pair of socks
Children can wear a plain black or navy tracksuit in the colder months.

Earrings must be removed – **no earrings are allowed at all.**

Please put your child's name in everything including shoes and trainers.

School bags need to be small in size to fit in the cloakroom.

PE Days in SEPTEMBER

EYFS: Please have PE kit in every day Year 1 and 2: Tuesday and Thursday Year 3 and 4: Tuesday and Thursday

Year 5 and 6: Tuesday (for the first three weeks then Friday) and Wednesday (swimming)





















Swimming - September



School swimming will continue to take place at Thirsk swimming pool. **Year 5** and **Year 6** children start on **Wednesday 11**th **September**. Please ensure your child has swimwear, goggles and a towel (named). It is helpful if girls wear socks and not tights on swimming days. Due to the layout and number of cubicles at Thirsk swimming baths, some children need to share a cubicle in order to change before and after the lesson. If any parents have questions or queries about this

then please don't hesitate to speak to Mrs Lyon. After Christmas children in Years 3 and 4 will go swimming.

The cost of swimming will be £6.00 each week, this still has to paid even if your child misses a swimming lesson as we still have to pay for the bus, pool hire and swimming instructors. Payments must be made on your Parent Pay account. School has heavily subsidised the cost of swimming due to rising prices from the bus company and constraints imposed by Thirsk Pool.

Ear-rings in PE

Please can I remind parents of the policy regarding the wearing of ear-rings in PE. Guidance was updated by the Association for PE a number of years ago.

All personal effects should be removed including earrings.

Newly pierced earrings can be removed after a 6-week healing duration. During this period students should be given alternative tasks within physical education such as officiating.

Students unable to remove earrings were previously permitted to make them safe by taping. The guidance on the aforementioned has now changed based on national advice issued by the Association for Physical Education (afPE) 2019. It is now felt that the taping of earrings 'creates a perception of safety and is not recommended', as there have been several incidences within the local authority where children's ears have been injured from earrings being pulled out from under the tape.

Teachers/TAs are not permitted to take out or replace children's earrings if they are unable to do so themselves, therefore, it would be helpful if earrings could be taken out at home on PE days. If a child has recently had their ears pierced and is unable to remove their earrings they will not be permitted to take part in the practical aspect of PE lessons for six weeks, after which time they will be expected to remove their earrings in order to participate in PE lessons. During this six-week period the child will be able to take on the role of umpire, referee or coach where appropriate.

Please be aware that this policy will be followed by school staff and Sport coaches.

Sporting Influence club

This academic year we have joined Sporting Influence who will provide PE and staff development in school as well as organising sporting competitions throughout the year that the school can participate in.

Some of the competitions allow mass participation and some competitions are for one team of seven children or five children from each school, depending on the nature of the sport.





















The competitions Dishforth Airfield will take part in are all held at Outwood Academy Ripon.

This term we will be taking part in the following competitions:

- Football (7 a side one team) 17th September
- High 5 Netball (one team) 8th October

Sporting Influence Club

In addition to the PE in school, staff development and competitions, Sporting Influence will also provide a club after school on a Tuesday from 3.15pm-4.00pm. The first club will be **Football** for the first half term for a maximum of 20 children from Key Stage 2. A letter will go out this week for the children to sign up. If more than 20 children want to take part then we will pull names out of a hat!

Forest Schools

I am delighted to welcome Miss Rachel Hunt back to Dishforth Airfield Primary School as Forest School teacher for this year! Forest Schools will take place on a Monday afternoon for the full afternoon for three weeks for each class at some point in the year. Here is a message from Miss Hunt:

Hello! I am delighted to be able to deliver Forest School sessions to all year groups over the course of the 2024 - 25 academic year. Forest School is child led, outdoor learning where children can learn a variety of skills from wood craft to fire lighting and challenge themselves to take risks whilst learning to respect and care for the natural world around them.

You can expect your child to get messy as we will be outdoors in all weathers so, please make sure that they bring clothes for every weather for every session. Ideally: wellies or walking boots; waterproof jacket and trousers or all in ones and a sun hat or woolly hat dependent on the temperature. I will provide safety gloves, but warm preferably waterproof gloves should be sent in the colder months.

Year 3 and 4 will have Forest Schools first on Monday 9th, 16th and 23rd of September in the afternoon.

<u>Clarinet Lessons – Year 5 and 6 children</u>

All the Year 5 and 6 children will be learning to play the clarinet this year as part of their music lessons in school and funded by school. This is a super opportunity for the children to learn an instrument and develop their knowledge and understanding of reading music.

Music Service – Instrumental Information

There are leaflets available in school providing information about instrumental and vocal tuition and how to apply for lessons.

Playtime Snack

Children in Reception, Year 1 and 2 receive a free fruit snack every day which is Government funded. Children in Year 3-6 can bring a piece of fruit in from home to keep in the classroom for playtime. I strongly recommend that you send fruit in for children in Year 3-6 as they have a long morning and often need a snack. Please can this be put in their book bag and not their packed lunch box as it is easier for them to access at break time – thank you.

Milk

Children under 5 are entitled to Free Milk. Older children can also receive milk (at a charge) and orders are made by yourself through the Cool Milk website. Forms are available outside the office in the foyer.

Water Bottles

We have provided, free of charge, a water bottle for every child in the school so that all children can have access to water throughout the day. We will be responsible for cleaning the bottles and filling them each day so your child does not need to bring one in from home.

Absence and Punctuality

If your child is absent from school through illness or appointments, please can you phone the school as early as possible each day they are absent. It is important that we keep our records accurate. Good attendance is essential for pupils to get the most out of their school experience, including their attainment, wellbeing, and wider life chances. Nationwide research has shown that the pupils with the highest attainment at the end of key stage 2 have had higher rates of attendance throughout primary school, compared to those with the lowest attainment. The government aims for all pupils to have a minimum of 95% attendance across the school year, and any child with less than 90% attendance is recorded as a persistent absentee.

Please can you also ensure that your child arrives to school promptly. Please ensure your child / children are at school for 8.40am ready for the bell to ring at 8.45am as lateness will be recorded.

Leave of Absence in Term Time

The Government implemented amendments to the regulations regarding holidays in term time a number of years ago. The amendments remove references to family holiday and extended leave as well as the threshold of ten school days. Therefore, Head Teachers will only be able to grant leave of absence in exceptional circumstances. There is no 'Holiday' code for absences at any school. Please refer to the leave of absence forms which are located next to the school office for full details. If a form is required then it must be filled out at least six weeks in advance or the absence is unauthorised. If a child misses a minimum of 10 sessions (one session is half a day) through unauthorised absence, then this can result in a 'notice to improve' (previously known as a penalty notice) being issued by the Local Authority.

ParentPay

Breakfast and After school club, school meals and nursery fees are put on Parent Pay at the end of every week. Please can we remind families to check their account on ParentPay and make sure bills are paid as soon as possible. New families to the school will receive login information for ParentPay once their child / children have started.

School Dinners

Children in Reception, Year 1 and 2 can have a school dinner free of charge.

Children in Nursery can order a school dinner and the cost of their meal is £2.10

Please note that the cost of a school dinner is £3.55 for children in Years 3-6. The cost for the month of September for children in Year 3-6 will be £71.00. (20 meals) School dinners are paid through ParentPay – new families will receive information regarding a login to ParentPay later this week.

Packed Lunches

A polite reminder that there should be no sweets or chocolate bars in packed lunches or fizzy drinks. Also, we are a **NUT FREE SCHOOL**. We do have children with allergies to nuts so please refrain from any sort of nut products in packed lunches – thank you.

Bookings for Dandelions Childcare

All bookings must be made by 12pm on a Friday for the following week so that we can ensure we have staffing ratios and food for the children. Accounts are put on ParentPay.
