Dear Parents / Carers,

#### **Harvest Festival**

Following this, the format is going to involve an open afternoon where you can spend time in your children's class / classes. This will be followed by a cake sale and refreshments at 2.45pm where the proceeds will go towards a charity chosen by the School Council.

Nursery parents are welcome to join us in the open classroom part of the afternoon in EYFS at 2.15pm

At 2.45pm all parents will be able to collect their children from class to have refreshments in the hall before home time.

We would like to have a cake bake sale with the refreshments on Thursday to raise money for the charity Self Help Africa. If you are able to donate cakes / biscuits for this it would be very much appreciated. ## **Class News:**

Every week the classes will share the highlights of what they have been learning about with our families:

**EYFS:** This week we have had a spooky week in Early Years. We have made witches potions listing our recipes. We have made our own 'magnificent brooms' in the creative area and added lots of exciting features. In maths we have been learning how to subitise where the children need to say the number of objects without counting 1 to 5.

**Year 1 and 2:** We have had another busy week this week - the children have made their final pinch pots following their designs and have designed our Christmas decoration. In PSCHE we have been learning about the PANTS by the NSPCC and that our pants are private. Let's talk PANTS with Pantosaurus! | NSPCC. In History we have been sorting toys into old and new and looking at the differences between the two. We have had great fun learning about non-fiction writing and using imperative verb (bossy verbs) to give commands! The children are excited about writing and then making their own potion next week.

**Year 3 and 4:** This week we have been exploring poetry in English and we are developing some of our writing skills in preparation for writing our own Autumnal poem next week. In Science we carried out a very interesting investigation to explore the effects that some liquids (fizzy drinks, energy drinks, sports drinks, milk, water and vinegar) have on our teeth. We were so shocked to see the impact that high sugar content drinks and also vinegar had on the shell of eggs (acting as our teeth) and lots of the children have decided that they will definitely avoid/ reduce their intake of these types of drinks in the future!

**Year 5 and 6:** In year 5/6 this week we have been learning about Muslims in R.E. We have been finding out about Muslims and their generosity towards charity and their beliefs linked to Allah. We are looking at two Muslim charities in the UK and what they do to help people all over the world.

## Good attendance at school is key to your child's progress.

Good attendance is essential for pupils to get the most out of their school experience, including their attainment, wellbeing, and wider life chances. Nationwide research has shown that the pupils with the highest attainment at the end of key stage 2 have had higher rates of attendance throughout primary school, compared to those with the lowest attainment. The government aims for all pupils to have a minimum of 96% attendance across the school year, and any child with less than 90% attendance is recorded as a persistent absentee. Here is our school's current overview of attendance:
