Dear Parents / Carers,

I hope you all enjoyed a lovely weekend after the very wet weather we had last week! Over the next few weeks in school there are a number of events happening so please read the newsletter carefully for dates and times and keep checking diary dates as new entries are being added.

We have a promotional school dinner this Thursday – Build a Burger – which the children can enjoy. Also, this week Clubs run by school staff begin – thank you to all the staff for giving up their time to put these on for the children.

Class News:

Every week the classes will share the highlights of what they have been learning about with our families:

EYFS: In Early Years this week we have had a visit from the Jolly Postman who delivered our class an invitation to Baby Bears party on Friday 4th October the children have been told they can bring a teddy bear. In preparation for the party the children have been busy making birthday cards and have many jobs next week to make sure they have everything they need. The children are very excited.

Year 1 and 2: This week Year 1 and 2 have been very busy. We have been learning all about poetry - we have been learning to read the poem aloud as a class and have been exploring the language and images from within it. The children have made pinch pots and added marks using clay tools. In DT we have been practicing our cutting skills - learning to turn the paper and keep the scissor straight up and down. We have also finished our week with a marble jar treat as the children have all been working hard.





















Year 3 and 4: This week we finished our first whole class reading book of the year, The Velveteen Rabbit. We were very pleased there was a happy ending in the end! We enjoyed learning about the different types of teeth we have and their functions in science and we are looking forward to carrying out some science investigations about teeth in the upcoming weeks. In French we have been learning how to say, read and write numbers up to 10. We started our PE lessons on football this week and worked really well within our teams to develop our skills.

Year 5 and 6: This week we have been learning about monologues in English. We have been playing the role of the main character from Running Wild. We have been building up our toolkit to help us write a monologue next week. We have also been doing some observational draws of landscapes in our art lessons using the sketching pencils to create shade and tone.

Black History Month - October

Through Black History Month, we learn so much about ourselves and our abilities to overcome challenges both big and small. We learn to reason and wonder about things morally. We also learn from mistakes people made in the past and learn the importance of treating others with compassion – we learn to be givers and helpers. Through this month we are using a number of assemblies to learn about significant people in history.

Music for Life - Tuesday 8th October

I am delighted to welcome Music for Life into school on Tuesday 8th October.

Music for Life originated through Sowerby Music over 14 years ago with the aim of helping small rural schools to access professional musicians. We have been fortunate to be involved with Music for Life throughout the whole of this time and have had a wide range of fantastic musicians into school who have truly inspired our children.

Next week we are welcoming Yorkshire born singer and teacher Eleonore Cockerham, who began performing internationally as a soloist from the age of 12. Eleonore went on to study at the Royal Northern College of Music in Manchester, where she studied under the tutelage of Mezzo Soprano, Louise Winter.





















Eleonore has toured across the globe singing as a soloist and with the ensemble VOCES8 at the Syndey Opera House, Tokyo Opera City, Palacio de Belle's Artes, Mexico, and BBC Proms at Cadogen Hall, London.

Stone Age Workshop - Year 3 and 4 - Wednesday 9th October

On Wednesday 9th October, Year 3/4 will be taking part in a Stone Age workshop. The children will be participating in a range of activities and experiences which will allow them to develop some hands-on skills whilst learning what life was like for their ancestors 10,000 years ago. The workshop includes; Primitive fire lighting, building Hunter Gatherer shelters, ancient bread making, tool making and exploring artefacts. We are really looking forward to it!

Next Thursday we will be celebrating Fiji Day. A huge thank you to members of the Fijian community who are coming to school to share the history of Fiji with the children and the staff.

Start Small, Dream Big - careers learning in school

As I wrote in last week's newsletter, I am delighted to let you know that I am taking part in a project called 'Start small, dream big' this year which is about bringing careers related learning into primary school.

The Careers and Enterprise Company, set up by the Government, has a mission which is 'to help every young person to find their best next step.'

Research shows that children can fix their aspirations and create future-limiting stereotypes by as young as six years of age. Research has also shown that Career-Related Learning (CRL) can widen aspirations and challenge stereotypes so that children keep an open mind about the world of work as they move through education.

Participation in this project will help to:

- Increase awareness and aspirations amongst primary aged children of the range of jobs and career pathways available to them in the future.
- Removal of barriers and stereotypes which limit children's thinking about their future careers.
- Provide children with a forward looking, realistic view of the jobs and the way that we work.
- Develop understanding amongst children of the link between what they learn in school, skills and the world of work.





















In order to support this project in school, I would like to invite parents / grandparents/ members of our school and local community to come in and talk to the children about their career journey to broaden their knowledge and understanding of different career pathways and opportunities. Reading

All children need to read at home every day. Please listen to your child read and ask them questions about the text and / or pictures. Please ensure that you record what your child has read and how they have managed with their reading in their record book. Reading and record books need to be in school every day so that they can be checked and new books issued.

ParentPay

Breakfast and After school club, school meals and nursery fees are put on Parent Pay at the end of every week. Please can we remind families to check their account on ParentPay and make sure bills are paid as soon as possible. New families to the school will receive login information for ParentPay once their child / children have started.

School Dinners

Children in Reception, Year 1 and 2 can have a school dinner free of charge.

Children in Nursery can order a school dinner and the cost of their meal is £2.10

Please note that the cost of a school dinner is £3.55 for children in Years 3-6. The cost for the month of October for children in Year 3-6 will be £67.45 (19 meals)

Attendance

Weekly Attendance

Good attendance at school is key to your child's progress.

Good attendance is essential for pupils to get the most out of their school experience, including their attainment, wellbeing, and wider life chances. Nationwide research has shown that the pupils with the highest attainment at the end of key stage 2 have had higher rates of attendance throughout primary school, compared to those with the lowest attainment. The government aims for all pupils to have a minimum of 96% attendance across the school year, and any child with less than 90% attendance is recorded as a persistent absentee. Here is our school's current overview of attendance:
