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## Newsletter 10 Monday 11th November 2024

Dear Parents / Carers,

I hope you have all had a lovely weekend. We have another busy week in school with it being antibullying week and Children in Need Day on Friday. Please read carefully for further details of these events as well as up and coming Christmas fundraising activities which are going to be taking place over the next few weeks.

Today our thoughts are very much about Remembrance and taking time to reflect on the sacrifices the Armed Forces personnel have made for us over time. On Wednesday, Year 5 and 6 children went to Ripon Cathedral for the Festival of Remembrance for Service Children. It was a wonderful afternoon which brought children from the Armed Forces together to celebrate and remember. We took part in singing, listened to letters from soldiers and their children from the Christmas of 1914.

Many of you will have seen the school installation of poppies in the main entrance from all the classes. In addition to this, a number of paintings from the children will be going to Co-op in Ripon to be displayed this week.

### **Class News:**

Every week the classes will share the highlights of what they have been learning about with our families:

**EYFS:** This week the children have been learning about Diwali the Hindu festival of light. The children have all made Diva lamps using clay, made Rangoli patterns using coloured rice and have designed Mendi patterns on handprints. The children have also explored creating firework pictures using chalk and making fireworks in the creative area with pipe cleaners and tissue paper.

**Year 1 and 2:** This week Year 1 / 2 have been super busy - we have been reading the story about Stubby a dog who goes to war with the soldier who adopted him and smuggled him on the ship. In Maths we have been learning to add and subtract. We had a fabulous time creating poppies based on the work of Georgia O'Keeffe and we have started to learn our nativity songs and dances!





















**Year 3 and 4:** This week we have enjoyed reading more of The Lion, the witch and the wardrobe and we have been making lots of inferences and predictions about what characters may do next and their motives for this. In Science we have started our new unit on electricity and began by exploring different ways electricity can be produced and exploring everyday appliances, identifying their type of electrical source.

**Year 5 and 6:** We have had a busy week in year 5/6. We started the week with a Forest Schools session with Miss Hunt. The children used many different tools, built dens and worked as a team. We look forward to next week! On Thursday, we began to explore acrylic paints in art. We then used the acrylics to create a painting of a solider to mark Remembrance Day.

## <u>Anti-bullying week – Odd Sock Day - tomorrow</u>

Anti-Bullying Week 2024 will take place from Monday 11th - Friday 15th November, with the theme: Choose Respect. Odd Socks Day is taking place on Tuesday 12th November, with adults and children being encouraged to wear odd socks to celebrate what makes us all unique. Breakfast and After school club, school meals and nursery fees are put on Parent Pay at the end of every week. Please can we remind families to check their account on ParentPay and make sure bills are paid as soon as possible. New families to the school will receive login information for ParentPay once their child / children have started.



## **Weekly Attendance**

## Good attendance at school is key to your child's progress.

Good attendance is essential for pupils to get the most out of their school experience, including their attainment, wellbeing, and wider life chances. Nationwide research has shown that the pupils with the highest attainment at the end of key stage 2 have had higher rates of attendance throughout primary school, compared to those with the lowest attainment. The government aims for all pupils to have a minimum of 96% attendance across the school year, and any child with less than 90% attendance is recorded as a persistent absentee.
