# Class News:

Every week the classes will share the highlights of what they have been learning about with our families:

**EYFS:** This week we have been exploring the story 'Pip and Egg' and learning about their friendship and how they are changing over time. In our English work we have got into character and thought about what each character would be saying and have written these in speech bubbles. In maths we have been exploring length and number 9 and 10.

**Year 1 and 2:** We have been researching and planning our Fiji Tourism videos that we are going to make next week. It has been a tough call to decide what to feature! In history, we have been looking at the equipment and resources that Shackleton and his crew used on the Endurance expedition and we are going to be making comparison with modern equivalents over the next couple of weeks. In computing we are starting to look at grouping and counting and how data information.

**Year 3 and 4:** This week we have been planning our final art pieces ready to create our Barbara Hepworth inspired sculptures. In Science we have learnt about the behaviour of particles in solids, liquids in gasses. In French we have been learning some more verbs. We loved world book day where we shared some of our favourite stories and created our own character inspired by 'The Day the Crayons Quit!'.

**Year 5 and 6:** This week, in year 5/6, we have been learning about how light travels and reflects. The children made a periscope using a cereal box and two mirrors which enabled them look over objects and around corners. The children also learnt about the incident ray and the reflected ray which meant using their skills from maths to help to find the perpendicular line. The children have also programmed their night lights to come on when it gets dark. We used software called Crumble to program a sparkle to light up in their chosen colours.

## Weekly Attendance

## Good attendance at school is key to your child's progress.

Good attendance is essential for pupils to get the most out of their school experience, including their attainment, wellbeing, and wider life chances. Nationwide research has shown that the pupils with the highest attainment at the end of key stage 2 have had higher rates of attendance throughout primary school, compared to those with the lowest attainment. The government aims for all pupils to have a minimum of 96% attendance across the school year, and any child with less than 90% attendance is recorded as a persistent absentee.
