Class News:

Every week the classes will share the highlights of what they have been learning about with our families:

EYFS: What a lovely first week back we have had in Early Years. The children have been so excited learning about the seaside through our new book "What the ladybird heard at the seaside". We explored sounds we hear at the beach and have created some lovely poems. We have also loved finding facts about sea creatures.

Year 1 and 2: This week in Year 1 and 2 we have started our new book in English called 'The Tear Thief' by Carol Ann Duffy which we are all thoroughly enjoying. In Maths we have begun our new topics on multiplication and division (year 1) and statistics (year 2). In PSHE we have looked at the importance of handwashing and how we can make meals healthier.

Year 3 and 4: This week we have started planning our own short stories to write in English over the next few weeks. We have used our new class story 'The Iron Man' by Ted Hughes to inspire our short stories. We have also enjoyed a wonderful performance of The Lion, the witch and the wardrobe at York Opera House. What a great first week back!

Year 5 and 6: In year 5/6 this week we have started our new science topic of 'Forces'. We began to look at the different forces acting upon every day object and how that force allows something to move or change shape. We will be investigating gravity next week! We also started to look at OS maps of our local area and we were able to identify the different OS symbols of landmarks around school, Boroughbridge and Ripon.

National Curriculum Assessments

Key Stage 2 Assessments - Year 6

Week commencing the 12th May, children in Year 6 are taking national curriculum tests in English grammar, punctuation and spelling, English reading and mathematics. The tests help measure the progress pupils have made and identify if they need additional support in a certain area. The tests are also used to assess schools' performance and to produce national performance data. At the end of the summer term the test results will be reported in: • English grammar, punctuation and spelling • English reading and Mathematics.

Teacher assessment: As there is no test for English writing, this will be reported as a teacher assessment judgement. This is a judgement the teacher will make, based on the child's work at the end of key stage 2. Parents will also receive a teacher assessment judgement for science. Please refer to the parent / carer information document which is attached to this newsletter.

Year 1 Phonic Screen Check

Children in Year 1 will take the phonic screen check during the period week commencing 9th June. The outcome of this check is reported to parents by the end of the summer term. If a child in Year 2 did not achieve the pass mark in Year 1, or if a child in Year 2 did not take the phonic screen check, then they will also take the check this year. Year 4 Multiplication Check

Children in Year 4 will take the national multiplication check in June during a two-week window commencing on the 2nd June. The outcome of this check is reported to parents by the end of the summer term. Please refer to the parent / carer information document which is attached to this newsletter.

The cost for the month of May for children in Year 3-6 will be £56.80. (16 meals)

Attendance

Weekly Attendance

Good attendance at school is key to your child's progress.

Good attendance is essential for pupils to get the most out of their school experience, including their attainment, wellbeing, and wider life chances. Nationwide research has shown that the pupils with the highest attainment at the end of key stage 2 have had higher rates of attendance throughout primary school, compared to those with the lowest attainment. The government aims for all pupils to have a minimum of 96% attendance across the school year, and any child with less than 90% attendance is recorded as a persistent absentee. Here is our school's current overview of attendance:
