Dear Parents / Carers.

I hope you have all had a lovely weekend despite the weather – it is looking like summer is returning this week particularly on Wednesday, so please ensure the children have sun cream on!

#### **Class News:**

Every week the classes will share the highlights of what they have been learning about with our families:

**EYFS:** This week we launched our new topic house and homes which is based on the children's interests. The children have enjoyed exploring homes from around the world looking at different countries and what homes look like in hotter and cooler countries. The children have been very busy drawing and writing a property description for their own home.

Year 1 and 2: This week we have finished writing our biographies of Neil Armstrong, the first man to walk on the moon. We were surprised to find out that he had been in the Navy, just like Ernest Shackleton and we can all recite those famous words "One small step for man, one giant leap for mankind". In science we were finding out about the functions of each part of a plant and we are looking forward to planting some of the seeds that Harlow Carr gifted to us next week. We are developing our coding skills and practised debugging our programmes in computing and in geography we have been finding out about key landmarks in London. It's been a busy week!

**Year 3 and 4:** This week we have really enjoyed finding out more about Tudor lifestyles, particularly the types of foods that Tudor people ate - we were very surprised by some of their food choices! In Maths we have been learning about shapes, their properties and how to draw them accurately. In English we have enjoyed starting our new class book, 'Krindlekrax'.

**Year 5 and 6:** Year 5/6 have had a fantastic first week back after half term. The Year 6's have started their bikeability workshops and have been learning the skills to be out on the road safely. Year 5 have undertaken a project on the environment and have investigated which plants will grow best in different areas of the school and have begun planting up the planters. Alongside all our learning the children have been developing their performance skills preparing for our class production of Alice in Wonderland!

New families to the school will receive login information for ParentPay once their child / children have started.

## **School Dinners**

Children in Nursery can order a school dinner and the cost of their meal is £2.10
Please note that the cost of a school dinner is £3.77 for children in Years 3-6.

# **Weekly Attendance**

Good attendance at school is key to your child's progress.

Good attendance is essential for pupils to get the most out of their school experience, including their attainment, wellbeing, and wider life chances. Nationwide research has shown that the pupils with the highest attainment at the end of key stage 2 have had higher rates of attendance throughout primary school, compared to those with the lowest attainment. The government aims for all pupils to have a minimum of 96% attendance across the school year, and any child with less than 90% attendance is recorded as a persistent absentee.
