# **Class News:**

Every week the classes will share the highlights of what they have been learning about with our families:

**EYFS:** This week we have got to the end of our 'Bear and the piano story'. The children have created some lovely maps of the city so that Bear wouldn't get lost. The children have also been exploring artwork created by Andy Warhol and creating some lions with a range of brightly coloured paint to go with our PSHE focus 'The Lion Inside'.

**Year 1 and 2:** This week in Year 1 and 2 we have been learning about acrostic poems and writing our own poems about Harvest. In art we are continuing our work on Picasso and have been exploring his style of portraiture through using photographs of ourselves!

**Year 3 and 4:** This week we have been putting our instruction giving to the test! We began by giving Mrs Armstrong instructions on how to make a jam sandwich and this got very messy to begin with! After making sure we were really precise and detailed with our instructions, we produced a perfect jam sandwich! We then followed instructions for mummifying an apple and will be adapting these to write our own instructions next week. In Science, we have continued to explore magnetism and investigated which different materials are magnetic and non-magnetic.

**Year 5 and 6:** This week we have been designing a first attempt of our lino cutting. The children sketched a design in their sketch book and then drew it onto the lino before they will use the lino cutter to cut out their design. We focused on nature and used Michelle Hughes as our inspiration. We have also been researching Viking life. The children are going to be creating a magazine article for the year 3/4 children to read and enjoy!

# **ParentPay**

# **School Dinners**

## Good attendance at school is key to your child's progress.

Good attendance is essential for pupils to get the most out of their school experience, including their attainment, wellbeing, and wider life chances. Nationwide research has shown that the pupils with the highest attainment at the end of key stage 2 have had higher rates of attendance throughout primary school, compared to those with the lowest attainment. The government aims for all pupils to have a minimum of 96% attendance across the school year, and any child with less than 90% attendance is recorded as a persistent absentee. Here is our school's current overview of attendance:
