Dear Parents / Carers,

We are very much looking forward to the festive period in school with a number of events coming up. A reminder that our Christmas Stall is running today and Friday after school. Class News:

Every week the classes will share the highlights of what they have been learning about with our families:

EYFS: This week we have been very busy preparing for our nativity the children have practised singing, dancing and acting and it is all coming together, which is fantastic. In English the children have been creating instructions for 'How to make a jam sandwich' ready for our journey to the moon. The children's favourite part was of course eating it!

Year 1 and 2: This week in Year 1 and 2 we have begun a wonderful new story in English called 'The Koala Who Could' which is about a Koala called Kevin who doesn't like change. In Maths we have been identifying 2D and 3D shapes and in DT we have been learning about levers and sliders in preparation for making Christmas cards.

Year 3 and 4: This week we have been writing our own time travel stories in English. In Science we have been exploring skeletons, naming and identifying animals based on these. In History, we have been learning about Ancient Egyptian Gods and Goddesses.

Year 5 and 6: This week in year 5/6, we have been learning about the planets in our solar system. We have been finding out information about each one and creating Top Trump cards for a chosen planet which we will use to create a class display. We have also been comparing a region in North America to Ripon in North Yorkshire. We used secondary sources to find out information such as: population, climate, culture and human and physical features. We then used this information to compare the two locations and find similarities and differences.

Please always assume school is open unless you hear via any of the above methods. Please do not phone the school to ask if we are open as we may need to keep the line clear in order to contact staff. Please check on the school Facebook page and check emails.

Learning would be sent home via the class email system direct from the class teacher.

Reading

All children need to read at home every day. Please listen to your child read and ask them questions about the text and / or pictures. Please ensure that you record what your child has read and how they have managed with their reading in their record book. Reading and record books need to be in school every day so that they can be checked and new books issued.





















ParentPay

Breakfast and After school club, school meals and nursery fees are put on Parent Pay at the end of every week. Please can we remind families to check their account on ParentPay and make sure bills are paid as soon as possible. New families to the school will receive login information for ParentPay once their child / children have started.

School Dinners

Children in Reception, Year 1 and 2 can have a school dinner free of charge. Children in Nursery can order a school dinner and the cost of their meal is £2.10 Please note that the cost of a school dinner is £3.77 for children in Years 3-6.

The cost for the month of November for children in Year 3-6 will be £75.40 (20 meals)

School dinners are paid through ParentPay – new families will receive information regarding a login to ParentPay later this week.

Packed Lunches

Weekly Attendance

Good attendance at school is key to your child's progress.

Good attendance is essential for pupils to get the most out of their school experience, including their attainment, wellbeing, and wider life chances. Nationwide research has shown that the pupils with the highest attainment at the end of key stage 2 have had higher rates of attendance throughout primary school, compared to those with the lowest attainment. The government aims for all pupils to have a minimum of 96% attendance across the school year, and any child with less than 90% attendance is recorded as a persistent absentee.
