Dear Parents / Carers,

I hope you have all had a lovely weekend. Please keep checking diary dates at the end of the newsletter as new dates are being added each week.

Class News:

Every week the classes will share the highlights of what they have been learning about with our families:

EYFS: This week we have been learning about the artist 'Kandinsky' and exploring how he used circles and squares in his artwork. The children have used fine paint brushes to paint circles that have a range of colours inside. This has really helped the children to develop their fine motor skills and their hand eye coordination.

Year 1 and 2: In Year 1 and 2 this week we have been learning about what it means to belong to a faith community in R.E. with a particular focus on the Christian and Islam religions. In PSHE, we have looked at different ways of paying for items and the history of how money started. In Art we have started to work on skills for collage.

Year 3 and 4: This week we have thoroughly enjoyed our trip to Murton Park where we brought our history topic of the Romans to life! In Art we have started to explore the artwork of Henry Moore and we are looking forward to developing our skills and using both chalk and charcoal to create our own inspired piece of art. In DT, we have explored moving picture books and the lever linkage systems in them in preparation for designing and making our own moving Easter cards.

Year 5 and 6: This week in year 5/6 we have begun our geography topic on South America. We have located the countries within South America, described their location and looked at some of the physical features of the countries. Next week we will be looking at Brazil and the rainforest. We have also started our new topic in DT where we will be aiming to design, make and evaluate a structure/shelter. The children had a challenge to make a structure out of newspaper, spaghetti, tape and mini marshmallows. We will be thinking about the purpose of our structure and who will use it.



Key Stage 2 trip to Murton Park

The KS2 children went to Murton Park on Thursday to be immersed into life as a Roman (for year 3/4) and a Viking (for year 5/6). The children got to experience what life would have been like, how they lived and the different activities they would have done in their daily life.

The year 3/4 children had to defend their Roman fort from the Celts, learnt how to write, made oil lamps out of clay and were shown the different weapons that the Romans would have used.

The year 5/6 children experienced a raid on the village, made clay pots, went into the long house to play games and to grind grain to make flour and also played the role of a Viking on duty who was guarding the village from attacking Saxons.

The children had an amazingly, immersive day and took on the role of Vikings and Romans with enthusiasm.

Start Small, Dream Big – please help!

Emergency Procedure for School Closure – weather related / loss of utilities

It is rare, however there are occasions where it has been necessary to close schools because of inclement weather, no electricity or because of lack of heating, so I would like to bring to your attention the procedures I will follow if this event occurs now that we are in winter:

- An email will be sent to all families via Arbor
- A direct message will be sent to families via Arbor
- A post will be put on the school Facebook page
- County Hall will be informed.

Hopefully, this will not happen but I feel it is better to be prepared.

Please always assume school is open unless you hear via any of the above methods. Please do not phone the school to ask if we are open as we may need to keep the line clear in order to contact staff. Please check on the school Facebook page and check emails.

Learning would be sent home via the class email system direct from the class teacher or school administrator.

Reading

All children need to read at home every day. Please listen to your child read and ask them questions about the text and / or pictures. Please ensure that you record what your child has read and how they have managed with their reading in their record book. **Reading and record books need to be in school every day so that they can be checked and new books issued.**

ParentPay

Breakfast and After school club, school meals and nursery fees are put on Parent Pay at the end of every week. Please can we remind families to check their account on ParentPay and make sure bills are paid as soon as possible. New families to the school will receive login information for ParentPay once their child / children have started.

School Dinners

Children in Reception, Year 1 and 2 can have a school dinner free of charge.

Children in Nursery can order a school dinner and the cost of their meal is £2.10

Please note that the cost of a school dinner is £3.77 for children in Years 3-6.

The cost for the month of January for children in Year 3-6 will be £71.63 (19 meals)

School dinners are paid through ParentPay – new families will receive information regarding a login to ParentPay later this week.

Packed Lunches

A polite reminder that there should be no sweets or chocolate bars in packed lunches or fizzy drinks. Also, we are a **NUT FREE SCHOOL**. We do have children with allergies to nuts so please refrain from any sort of nut products in packed lunches – thank you.

Attendance

Weekly Attendance

Good attendance at school is key to your child's progress.

Good attendance is essential for pupils to get the most out of their school experience, including their attainment, wellbeing, and wider life chances. Nationwide research has shown that the pupils with the highest attainment at the end of key stage 2 have had higher rates of attendance throughout primary school, compared to those with the lowest attainment. The government aims for all pupils to have a minimum of 96% attendance across the school year, and any child with less than 90% attendance is recorded as a persistent absentee. Here is our school's current overview of attendance:
