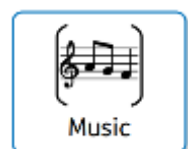
You will need to choose one activity per week from this side of the grid. You only choose two from this area.

What toys and games did your parents play with when they were younger?

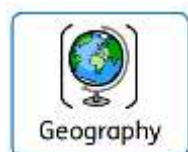
Find out about outdoor games that children played when your parents were young.
